

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. What are some of the side effects of testosterone replacement therapy?

- A. Testosterone replacement therapy may produce the following adverse events; if any of these occur, consult your doctor immediately:
- Breast development and breast discomfort
 - Extra fluid in the body (edema)
 - Prostate enlargement accompanied by difficulty in urinating

Q. Are there patients who should not receive testosterone replacement therapy?

- A. Yes. You should not be given testosterone replacement therapy if you have either of the following conditions:
- Prostate cancer
 - Breast cancer (a rare condition for men)

Q. Will I feel the TESTOPEL® under my skin?

- A. It is unlikely that you will feel TESTOPEL® under your skin.

Q. How will my doctor know when to replace my TESTOPEL®?

- A. Your doctor will order blood tests to determine your current level of testosterone.

Q. When I used testosterone gel I was required to thoroughly wash my hands after administration so I wouldn't transfer the drug to those I might touch. Are there any similar restrictions with TESTOPEL®?

- A. No. After insertion, wait a few hours before bathing. Also, try not to swim or use a hot tub for a few days post insertion. Your doctor will provide some specific guidance.

TESTOPEL[®] ADMINISTRATION IS FAST AND EASY

- Other than the initial stick of a needle used to numb the insertion area, **TESTOPEL**[®] insertion is pain-free.
- The insertion area will be at approximately the top of your pants back pocket.
- Each **TESTOPEL**[®] pellet is very small (shown here).
- **TESTOPEL**[®] is placed just below the fat lining the skin (subdermal fat). Once implanted, most men have no awareness that the pellets are there.
- Your doctor will determine the right number of pellets for you.
- After **TESTOPEL**[®] is inserted, your doctor will close the implant site using Steri-Strips™. Stitches are not needed. The area will then be bandaged and a cold compress applied.
- Patients can return to work the same day. Patients should wait a few hours before bathing. It is advisable not to swim or use a hot tub for a few days after **TESTOPEL**[®] placement.
